### **Every Step Matters!**



## **Prison in-reach support**

**Crime Prevention Initiative** 

We are working together with Riverside School Worcester to provide pathways to healthier lifestyles for children who take part in Stepway Community Gardens.

Here they can also accomplish parts of their Duke of Edinburgh Awards as the children develop knowledge and skills for life. Much of our prison in-reach work is to keep the residents updated on the support that we can offer upon release but also that we can support their families on the outside.

A large percentage of the support is on an advisory basis, passing on details (via the prison staff) of agencies that can offer them specific guidance for issues that they may have on release, including housing, finances, and mental health services.

In the future we hope to be able to offer our 7 Step Civilian Skills program again, however HMP Hewell currently has quite a small community of veterans of which the majority are on remand awaiting court appearances or sentencing. The ideal would be to offer 7 Steps to a group who are within 3 months or so of release.

HMP Oakwood is a completely different environment, which currently has a large veteran community of which many are long termers. Again, much of the work is in an advisory capacity for both inmates and their families. We would also like to offer 7 Steps to HMP Oakwood, along with other prisons in the future, however the relationship between the prison and Stepway is still relatively new.

The big differences between the 2 prisons in which we are currently active, are that one is a privately run prison and the other is run by HMPPS. The private prisons have more scope and resources for the residents. The privately run facility has a woodworking workshop, which produces all manner of items, from hedgehog houses to playhouse and bird feeders to benches, which are available to buy by the public at very low costs and are available outside the Visitors Centre (on Friday's and Saturday's). There is a section, which teaches welding and a petting zoo for family visiting days (including owls, rabbits, chickens, ducks, and several other birds).

This is just a small snapshot of the works going on behind bars and the potential to support/work with offenders/ex-offenders in the future.
