Job Description

This person will be based in Tewkesbury networking with other organisations to encourage the local community to become involved.

STEPWAY is a support network for Veterans primarily referred from partner organisations within the community, our programmes are focused on early intervention, support, and empowerment.

This role is to ensure the breaking down barriers between Veterans and Civilians.

The applicant for this role will have a track record of delivering high quality results, with a strong beneficiary focus and be capable of working independently to targets and deadlines. Strong communication, networking and organisational skills are essential along with mentoring and coaching people in the wider community.

Experience & knowledge of the complex needs and mental health within the wider Community, local government agencies and the ability to develop a network of contacts are also required. Experience in building a safe place where all the community access and enjoy activities.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES

- Recruitment of volunteers
- Oversee the running of the Community project with a team of volunteers.
- Written monthly reports including data capture to be sent to the Project Manager.
- To work with Civilians and Veterans alike to break down those barriers.
- Develop a friendly and safe environment.
- Build new working relationships with the National Probation Service (Community Pay back) Local Schools and Colleges.

The upkeep and development of the community project by introducing the following activities- Beekeeping, Mushroom farm, Foraging, Bushcraft and Archery.

- Highly motivated and independent, capable of working remotely from the Project Manager
- Resilient and able to work with individuals with complex needs and cope with the rigors that arise from working with veterans with mental health conditions and struggling with substance misuse/addiction.
- Commitment to working with each veteran without prejudice and in an equitable manner, including those who have a criminal record for violent or sexual offences.
- Experience of working with people using a mentoring or coaching approach to engage and support the individuals we work with to feel empowered.
- Highly organised with strong networking skills and experience of using Microsoft 365.
- Strong communicator.
- Excellent team players who will contribute to a diverse and dedicated team.
- Driving license and use of own car.
- To provide cover or find sustainable cover.
